Re: Potential DeVry Federal Loan Discharge

Dear Former DeVry Student:

This letter is to inform you that you may be eligible to obtain a federal loan discharge due to recent actions taken by the United States Department of Education (“DOE”). You are eligible to apply for this discharge even if you received restitution under settlements obtained by the New York State Attorney General (“NYAG”) and/or the Federal Trade Commission (“FTC”) with DeVry Education Group, Inc. and its subsidiaries DeVry University and DeVry/New York, Inc. (collectively, “DeVry”) that resolved investigations that revealed that DeVry exaggerated claims about graduates’ success in finding employment and inadequately substantiated claims about graduates’ salary outcomes. You are receiving this letter because NYAG records identify you as having attended DeVry.

We encourage you to take advantage of this opportunity if you believed DeVry’s job claims and those claims influenced your decision to attend DeVry. To apply, you must submit a claim to DOE in a process known as borrower defense to repayment. You can start that process at <https://studentaid.gov/borrower-defense/>. If you received restitution from the NYAG or FTC settlement, you should mention that when you fill out your claim form.

If you have already applied to have your DeVry federal loan discharged, you can check your status under “Manage My Applications” at <https://studentaid.gov/borrower-defense/>. About 1800 former DeVry students have already had their federal loans discharged.
